

Neighborhood Improvements

This spring, the Oak Hill neighborhood will see significant upgrades to its sidewalks, streets, and neighborhood park.

In April of 2021, the city launched a Sidewalk Assessment Management Plan to establish an existing inventory of sidewalks under the nationally recognized Pavement Surface Evaluation and Rating System (the same system used to rate the condition of our streets) and to establish a maintenance plan. By comparing the sidewalk and street ratings for 2021, it was determined the Oak Hill neighborhood had the most need for improvements in both streets and sidewalks. In



addition, Oak Hill Park was included in the Parks Master Plan as a priority for needed improvements making Oak Hill the first neighborhood in the city to have transformational investment since creating the plan.

Work is scheduled to begin tentatively in April of this year and will include newly paved streets, curbs and gutters, ADA-approved sidewalks and ramps, driveway approaches, and a fully upgraded park.


