## Breathing new life into an old neighborhood...

Oak Hill is one of the larger neighborhoods within our city limits, and it has been overlooked for many years. In the Spring of 2021, we decided to re-structure our road and sidewalk maintenance evaluation methods, to pair the worst sidewalks with the worst streets, showing us what area needs the most help. Everything overwhelmingly pointed to Oak Hill.

"It's a very nice neighborhood, and was planned out well, but it has been absent of infrastructure improvements for a very long time, sort of neglected," said Mindy McGee, Deputy Mayor.

With the roads almost completed and the sidewalks close behind, the neighborhood is now seeing the results of the project. The project will also focus on beautifying Oak Hill Park, which will have a new park with a basketball court, more accessible parking, and a shelter house. The park is projected to be completed in the summer of 2023.

"One of the biggest things I've heard from neighbors is that they are going to love walking down the sidewalks unobstructed and being able to go from wherever they live in Oak Hill to the park or something of that nature," said Kenny Washer, Street Department Supervisor.

"So far it's been a positive response, I think they appreciate that we recognized that the neighborhood was in pretty poor shape," said McGee. "I hope they're happy in the end. I think their property values are going to see a boost from it."


It's time to sign up for Pickleball!
