


## Celebrating Black History Month Together




### A Foundation of History:

In celebration of Black History Month, we gathered with dozens of locals at Gaines Park (site of the former Broadway School) to hear from Mayor Bob Courtney, Sue Livers and Broadway School Alumnus Chuck Cosby as they reflected on the significance of this historical community-shaping location and the legacy it has left behind.

We learned more about the history of this location, where the first commissioned African American high school in Indiana once stood, and the impact it had on Madison. We also celebrated the groundbreaking of the new park renovations this summer.

The new park will have a new modern playground to meet state code, refurbishment and extension of the current shelter house, a new basketball court and goals, and open space for the community to use for meetings and gatherings.

# Paving a way forward with a mission of accessibility:

Have you heard the news? During our February 7 city council meeting at the newly renovated Crystal Beach Pool House, we were thrilled to announce our partnership with the Bethany Legacy Foundation, the Jefferson County Commissioners, and Jefferson County Community Foundation to close the funding gap for rehabilitating the pool.



When we realized the original pool was dangerous and beyond repair in 2022, we used its "seashore" design to inspire the concept for the new, modern pool with unique features that will appeal to all generations. The new Crystal Beach Aquatic Park will have an activity tower for children, lap lanes, a lazy river, two slides, a diving board, a wet deck, chairs and umbrellas and will be accessible for all. We can't wait to bring this state-of-the-art aquatic park to our beautiful city next year, making Madison even more clean, safe and beautiful for every generation, all ability levels, and every socioeconomic status.

The second floor of the pool house where the meeting was held has been named Hunter Hall in honor of the original pool architect, Frank Baldwin Hunter. Hunter invented the "seashore" design, a saucer-shaped pool with sandy beaches, and designed several municipal swimming pools in partnership with the Works Progress Administration in Indiana. He is best remembered as a residential architect in Indianapolis, designing over 600 homes in the Meridian-Kessler and Butler - Tarkington neighborhoods, but is most recognized for his pool designs.

Thank you to Bethany Legacy Foundation, Jefferson County Commissioners, Community Foundation, and others for helping us bring the very best to our city, and for making it accessible to all.

## P.A.C.E. Updates and News

#### **Restoration and Revitalization**

The City of Madison's P.A.C.E. Grant Program has seen enormous private investment take place over the past few years. 11 new projects approved for funding in January 2023. \$148,000 in public funds are being matched by \$273,000 from property owners. Projects range from replacement entry doors to demolition of unsafe structures, such as the one shown here.



Mayor Courtney along with the P.A.C.E. Committee are pleased to announce a new pilot program under the PACE umbrella. The new program is being called the Curb Appeal Grant and will help property owners in the 2023 Hilltop target area complete work on the exterior of their home. This program is a dollar for dollar match up to \$5,000 to help fund exterior wall repairs, new doors or windows, lead-based paint testing/remediation, and new exterior paint or stain.

The improvement of a single property can brighten an entire neighborhood. Thank you to every privateproperty owner who has taken the initiative to partner with us through this program as we continue to make Madison clean, safe and beautiful. 
