Our staff and many community members brought in supplies over the month of July that matched the list of needs we were given, resulting in over 1,000 items donated! Madison Police Department Successfully Implements State-Funded Speed Enforcement Program:

The Madison Police Department (MPD) is proud to announce the successful implementation of a state-funded speed enforcement program aimed at enhancing road safety in our community. From July 10 to July 31, our dedicated officers conducted 163 traffic stops, issued 123 warnings, and issued 29 tickets to individuals who violated traffic laws, resulting in safer roads and contributing to the wellbeing of our citizens.

This program was intended to remind all residents that traffic safety is a shared responsibility, and adherence to traffic laws is essential to ensure the safety of drivers, pedestrians and cyclists alike.

In addition to the significant impact on traffic safety, the MPD's efforts yielded further succession in criminal apprehensions and the arrest of an individual operating a vehicle while intoxicated. Two felony drug arrests were made during the operation as well, contributing to the ongoing efforts to combat the drug-related issues in our community.

We would like to extend our gratitude to the state for funding this critical speed enforcement program. The support provided has enabled us to take decisive action to improve road safety and uphold the law effectively. On behalf of the Madison Police Department, Chief of Police, John I. Wallace expressed, "deep appreciation to our officers for their professionalism and hard work in executing this enforcement operation. Their dedication to duty and the protection of our community is commendable."

Being designated a Cultural District by the State, the City of Madison recognizes the importance of beautifying public areas and finds that such investment significantly enhances the quality of life for its citizens, tourists, and business owners.

The commission was established to bring more public art to our community and promote creative spaces in an organized fashion.


