Through the Flood,

On the night of June 18, the city was impacted by a severe storm that led to flash flooding, wreaking havoc on homes and businesses. With the water rising to levels of 5 feet in some homes, several local organizations and churches assisted the city in its efforts to provide aid and shelter for the affected residents.

With the recent disaster declaration from the United States Small Business Administration (USSBA), there is now a disaster relief center where those affected by the event can find resources for their aid and can apply for the assistance offered through the USSBA.

"The USSBA Disaster Declaration is the first



step toward helping our community recover. We encourage everyone impacted by the recent flooding to apply for the assistance offered by the USSBA whether you believe you will qualify or not," said Mayor Bob Courtney.

The relief center will be open this week (July 12th - 16th) from 8 AM to 5 PM in the Madison Chamber building at 301 E Main St.

Heroes Among Us

Honoring our veterans, what better way to start our month!

We are proud to recognize the heroes who walk among us every day and in our City Council meeting on June 8th we were honored to do just that. We recognized and honored veteran Donald J. King and presented him with the 2021 John Menke Award for Military Service.

Mr. King served in WWII and was awarded the Prisoner of War Medal, Good Conduct Medal, American Theatre Medal, European-African-Middle Eastern Campaign Theatre Medal with 3 Bronze Stars, and Victory Medal of WWII.

He, his wife, and family, all attended the evening event; where one of King's grandchildren read a poem and we watched a slideshow - in which we could see photos of notices explaining to King's family that he was MIA. The evening was a powerful testament to King and his service to our country.



In addition to the dedication to King, the city also recognized Madison residents Michael S. Malone, Ricky L. Erwin, and Jesse Hutchinson as outstanding citizens for their rescuing and comforting a lost child until police officers arrived on the scene. Chief

Over the past few weeks, the city has updated the clubhouse, implemented new marketing strategies, and will reopen the grill with an expanded menu.
